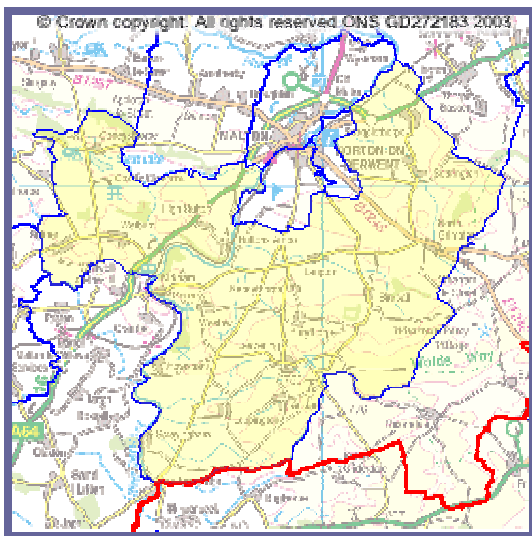

Introduction

Ryedale is a predominantly rural area covering some 575 square miles (148,900 hectares) in North Yorkshire. Geographically, the largest district in North Yorkshire, Ryedale comprises a rich agricultural area, as well as including part of the North York Moors National Park. The district population 50,872 (2001 Census) is centred mainly in the twin towns of Malton and Norton, where the administration centre has been established, and the market towns of Pickering, Kirkbymoorside and Helmsley.

The resident population of Ryedale, as measured in the 2001 Census, was 50,872, of which 49 per cent were male and 51 per cent were female.

Please note that the information published in this document is from various sources and taken at different points in time and therefore may show some inconsistencies. Some of the Census Statistics have been randomly adjusted to avoid the release of confidential data and may not sum due to rounding.

General Description

Derwent Ward

This ward covers the north-western edge of the Yorkshire Wolds and encompasses Birdsall and Langton Estates and their associated villages. The Wolds are the most northerly extension of the belt of chalk-land that extends up from Salisbury Plain and the Chilterns. Unsurprisingly, given the presence of two estates, the ward also had the highest proportion of households that rent their home as part of their job or business.

The main houses of note are Birdsall House, belonging to the Willoughby family and transformed by the architect Anthony Salvin in 1871-75, Langton Hall the former home of the Northcliffe family and Howsham Hall, a Jacobean house built by Sir William Bamburgh around 1610. The grounds of the Hall were landscaped by Nathaniel Cholmley between 1755 and 1792 with the advice of Capability Brown. Some demolition of the village occurred as a result. The remains of Kirkham Priory, founded for Augustinian Canons by Walter Espec, Lord of Helmsley, around 1125, sits in the glacial overflow channel of former Lake Pickering. Above Birdsall, on a hill spur, are the remains of an early Norman Castle destroyed around 1150 (Pevsner, 1966).

The settlements that make up the ward show a mixture of Old English (OE) and Old Scandinavian (OScand) derived place names, many of them traceable to the Domesday Book (DB):

Leavening	Settlement of the family or followers of a man called Leofheah (OE) (<i>Lelinghe</i> 1086 DB)
Leppington	Estate associated with a man called Leppa (OE) (<i>Lepinton</i> 1086 DB)
Scagglethorpe	Probably outlying farmstead or hamlet of a man called Skakull or Skakli (OScand) (<i>Scachetorp</i> 1086 DB)
Scrayingham	Homestead of the family or followers of a man called Scirheah or homestead with a structure of poles (OE)
Settrington	Possibly estate associated with a robber or with a man called Saetere (OE) (<i>Sendriton</i> 1086 DB: <i>Seteringetune</i> 1090)
Welburn	Stream fed by a spring, (<i>Wellebrune</i> 1086DB)
Westow	Holy place of the women or of a woman called Wife (OE)

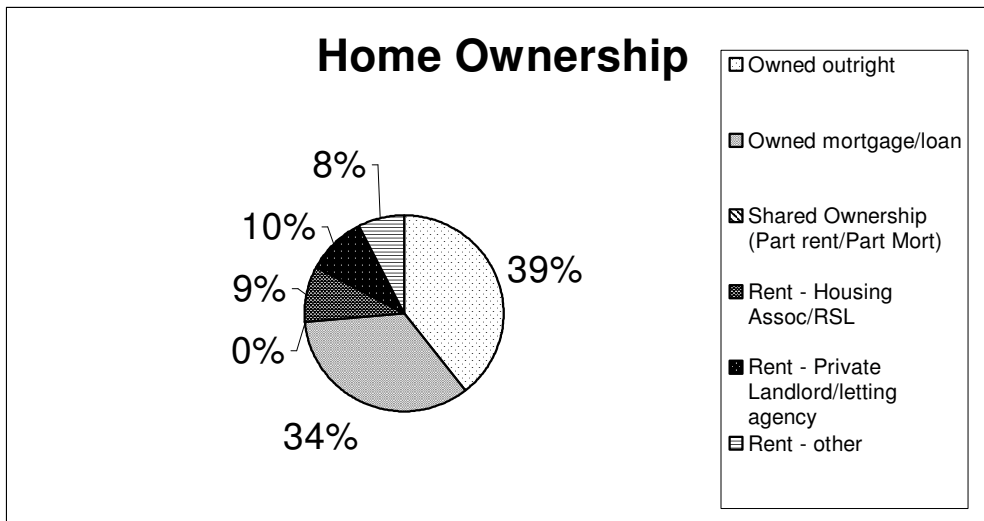

Indices of Deprivation

The Indices of Deprivation 2004 were published by the Department for Communities & Local Government (DCLG) in May 2004, and revised in June 2004. They measure deprivation at a small area level of Lower Layer Super Output Areas (SOAs). SOAs are a new geography designed for the collection and publication of small area statistics and fit within current Ryedale ward boundaries. The ID 2004 updates the ID 2000 in two key ways, more up-to-date data has been used and new measures have been incorporated as new and improved data sources have become available, therefore ID 2000 and ID 2004 are not comparable.

Index of Multiple Deprivation

The IMD 2004 provides an overall score of deprivation, combining 7 distinct categories of deprivation, known as domains. These domains cover:

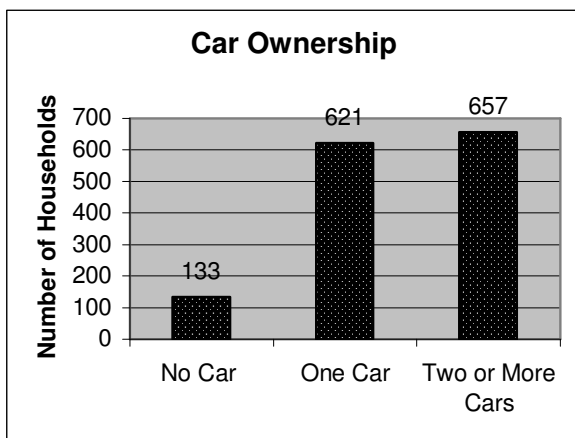
